Exploring a city can be tricky if you don't know your way around, or even what to look out for. Get a flavour of Belfast with this taster to help navigate your way around the city's areas and quarters.



#### CITY CENTRE

Home to the iconic Belfast City Hall, St George's Market and the main shopping district. You'll be spoilt for choice with the abundance of cool cafés, great pubs, trendy bars and an amazing restaurant scene. Start off in the Visit Belfast Welcome Centre (opposite City Hall) to pick up information, book tours and find out everything to make the most of your visit.



#### CATHEDRAL QUARTER

Packed full of fascinating architecture, buzzing beer gardens, trendy warehouse restaurants, cobblestoned streets and colourful street art, this area of town contrasts the old with the new, with St. Anne's Square, home to the Metropolitan Arts Centre (MAC) and a piazza of welcoming eateries, alongside some of the oldest streets in Belfast.



#### LINEN QUARTER

Belfast was once nicknamed "Linenopolis" as it was the world leader in the production of linen in the 19th Century. Just south of City Hall, you can enjoy the architecture of the old linen mills which house a mix of offices, chic bars and renowned restaurants. This is a great part of town to enjoy dinner and drinks before an entertaining show at the Grand Opera House.



# TITANIC QUARTER

Steeped in memories of a bygone era, the Titanic Quarter is now a fun and energetic urban waterfront development. Visit or take a tour of the many historic and state-of-theart Titanic visitor attractions, or simply stroll around the Maritime Mile to learn more about the city's shipbuilding heritage.



#### QUEEN'S QUARTER

The area around Queen's University is a treasure trove of eclectic shops, boutiques, cafés, bars and art galleries. Visit the collections of the Ulster Museum, stroll around Botanic Gardens. The neighbouring Lisburn Road offers designer shopping, cafés, artisan delis, salons and wine bars.



# **GAELTACHT QUARTER**

The centre for Irish language, music and culture is in the west of the city. An Cultúrlann showcases cultural Irish Gaelic traditions and contains a restaurant. gift shop, theatre and gallery. Explore the stunning Clonard Monastery or enjoy the 3 mile Divis Summit Trail, a specifically designed loop walk on Divis Mountain with spectacular views over Belfast.



#### EAST SIDE

EastSide was once the beating heart of the city's industrial past and is now thriving once again but this time as a hub of culture and creativity. Make the EastSide Visitor Centre your first stop, with information on key attractions in east Belfast, and take a trail to discover the home of George Best, CS Lewis and Van Morrison.



#### THE SHANKILL

Straddling North and West Belfast, the Shankill is home to a wide collection of painted murals depicting the social and political history of the area. Places of interest include the Peace Wall, the Old Shankill Graveyard, dating back to the 14th century, the Shankill Memorial Park and the ancient Bullaun Stone. The Spectrum Centre, a major landmark in the area, hosts a range of events and exhibitions.



# TITANIC'S STORY







Over four hundred years have passed since the first settlers made Belfast their home: public buildings, museums and visitor centres will let you discover the city's rich history and heritage.

The history of Belfast begins at Clifton House. Through the use of world class immersive technology, you will be transported back in time to the Belfast Poor House (1774) which provided sanctuary to thousands of people right up to 1882. The Mary Ann McCracken Walking Tour takes place every Friday at 2pm or the House and Graveyard Tours run every Saturday and Sunday at 11am. cliftonbelfast.com

The Linenhall Library, located opposite Belfast City Hall, is the city's oldest library (1788) and houses one of the most renowned collections of Irish material in the world. Browse the collections, visit the gift shop or relax in the coffee shop. linenhall.com

#### St Anne's Cathedral is

Romanesque in style with exquisite mosaics, carvings and stained glass. You can take a self-guided tour of this stunning building to learn its history and learn about the people who helped shape this sacred place. belfastcathedral.org

Based in a former Presbyterian church, **Cultúrlann McAdam**Ó Fiaich is an arts and cultural centre with a strong focus on Irish language and culture.
The interactive space on the 1st floor, provides an insight into the development of Irish language and culture in Belfast and on how Irish has influenced English. **culturlann.ie** 

Visit the **Discover Ulster Scots Centre** on Gordon Street where you can discover thousands of years of history, from the formation of the Giant's Causeway (which links County Antrim with the Western Isles of Scotland) right up to the present day. **discoverulsterscots.com** 

#### **Belfast City Cemetery**

Visit one of the oldest public cemeteries in the city and the final resting place of many notable figures. # The Maritime Mile begins on the city side of the river, linking Belfast's historic Sailortown

The Maritime Mile begins on the city side of the river, linking Belfast's historic Sailortown across to Titanic Quarter. Take a stroll to explore this historic area and discover the rich history and tradition of the city's shipbuilding heritage.

#### SINCLAIR SEAMEN'S CHURCH

Built by Charles Lanyon in 1857-58 to meet the spiritual needs of visiting sailors, this part church, part maritime museum has a pulpit shaped like a ship's prow, a brass ship's wheel and binnacle (used as a baptismal font) salvaged from a WWI wreck and the ship's bell from HMS Hood.

#### **BELFAST HARBOUR** COMMISSIONERS

This stunning building dates back to 1847, and you can visit an exhibition in the Heritage Room which celebrates 400 vears of Belfast's maritime history, detailing Belfast's emergence as a major port and the city's subsequent growth and development as an industrial hub.

#### CLARENDON DOCK & CITY QUAYS

The dry docks where Belfast's shipbuilding industry was born date back to 1800-1826. Both docks were used to work on ships' hulls and the workshop was designed for working on the rigging of sailing ships. The area has now been transformed into the City Quays development, home to a mix of commercial offices, shops, cafes, restaurants as well as the AC Hotel by Marriott Belfast.

#### THE BIG FISH

The beautiful blue scales on the Salmon of Knowledge (affectionately known as The Big Fish) are made up of ceramic tiles depicting scenes from the city's history. Legend has it that if you kiss the fish you'll gain all of its wisdom!

#### **LAGAN WEIR**

A wide, modern foot and cycle bridge connecting the city centre with Titanic Quarter, Beautifully illuminated in the evening, take a seat and enjoy the views of the city from the River Lagan.

#### **GLASS OF THRONES**

You'll find 6 Game of Thrones stained glass windows dotted along the Maritime Mile, from AC Hotel past Titanic Studios to HMS Caroline. Take a stroll to rediscover the most iconic moments from the saga immortalised in stained glass.

#### THE BELFAST BUOYS

The three buoys are estimated to be around 80 years old, and would have been used by mariners to find a safe channel to and from port. Recently restored to their original colours, they have been installed as a permanent display at Abercorn Basin.

#### SS NOMADIC

The last remaining White Star Line vessel, SS Nomadic, has been restored to her original glory and is back home in the historic Hamilton Dock. near Titanic Belfast, Come on board and experience over 100 years of authentic maritime and social history.

#### TITANIC BELFAST

#### TITANIC & **OLYMPIC SLIPWAYS**

Behind Titanic Belfast you'll find the historic slipways where these famous ships were built and launched over a hundred years ago. Containing many original features, a Memorial Garden illustrates the proportion of Titanic's victims and survivors from each of the passenger classes and crew. The outline of the sister ships illuminate at night and are the perfect space to reflect.

#### TITANIC HOTEL BELFAST

The original red brick building is a truly authentic part of Titanic's story. Harland and Wolff had two main drawing offices within the building, Drawing Office Two is now the vibrant heart of the hotel where you can relax

and enjoy lunch, dinner or even a cocktail or two. This breathtaking room is where many of the world's most famous ocean liners, including RMS Titanic, were painstakingly designed.

#### THE GREAT LIGHT

This former lighthouse optic is a unique heritage object with significance to Belfast's economic industrial maritime past. Originally serving both Mew and Tory Island lighthouses, the optic is the largest of its kind ever constructed and dates back to 1887. It is lit all year round and has amazing views over Belfast Harbour and Lough.

#### **HICKSON'S POINT**

Make a stop to 'rest your wee leas' while out enjoying the Maritime Mile. Offering an authentic 1900's public house setting, serving up perfect pints and classic Clangers with traditional music, heritage décor and a beer garden! Located on the plaza outside Titanic Belfast, Hickson's Point is open daily and dog-friendly!


#### SOUND YARD

Found on the sides of houses and walls across East and West Belfast, many pieces of artwork are closely associated with the Troubles. These Republican and Loyalist political statements present visitors with a fascinating picture of how two communities, living side by side, can have such a different sense of history. Yet, in recent years, a new breed of mural has evolved containing messages of hope and achievement, depicting colourful celebrations of the city's famous sons and daughters.

Modern Belfast has become a place where street artists from across the world gather to produce their work. Spend just a few minutes in the city centre and you'll notice the walls - there is street art to be explored everywhere. This generation of street artists are creating a vibrant and new narrative for the city.

The charming and historic Cathedral Quarter has the highest concentration of street art in Belfast. Some of the most iconic pieces include 'Blurry Eyed' on Talbot Street, 'Woman and Parrot' on Gresham Street, 'The Chef' on High Street, 'Star People' on Kent Street, 'The Acrobat' on Donegall Street

and 'The Duel of Belfast, Dance By Candlelight' on Hill Street.

Make sure to visit the cobblestoned Commercial Court, where you will find a canopy of 21 rainbow-coloured illuminated umbrellas, which turn into a stunning lightshow at night and is one of the most photographed streets in the city. Tucked to the side is a hidden entry where you will find a mural containing caricatures of famous faces from Belfast and the island of Ireland.

From formal, manicured flowerbeds to sprawling meadows and woods, there are some fantastic places to be enjoyed, so this summer pack a picnic and explore one of our beautiful parks or gardens.

#### **Botanic Gardens**

This public park contains an extensive rose garden, long herbaceous borders and rare oaks. The Palm House (1852) contains a range of tropical plants, hanging baskets, seasonal displays and birds of paradise, and is a masterpiece of moulded glass and wrought iron.

#### Belfast Castle Estate

The estate contains landscaped gardens and mature mixed woodland, and offers superb views of the city. It's home to many different species of wildlife and Belfast's rarest plant; the town hall clock. Look out for the nine cats depicted in the paving, sculptures and garden furniture of the Cat Garden.

#### **Barnett Demesne**

Home to Malone House, an elegant mansion dating back to the 1820's, which commands stunning views over acres of magnificent parkland, Lagan Valley and the Belfast Hills. Barnett Demesne is also home to an arboretum, daffodil garden

and a number of woodland and wildflower meadows. Enjoy walks linking to the adjacent Lagan Towpath.

#### Stormont Estate

In this 407 acre estate you will find the impressive Parliament Buildings, beautiful formal gardens, a children's adventure playground, statues, memorials and some interesting WW2 sites. Choose from the 2.5 mile long woodland walk, the 1.4 mile short woodland or the 1 mile fitness trail with outdoor gym equipment.

#### Sir Thomas and Lady Dixon Park

The International Rose Garden at Sir Thomas and Lady Dixon Park is amongst the best in the world, with over 45,000 roses in bloom during the summer months. Enjoy picturesque walking trails, a children's playground, barbecue area and The Stables Coffee Shop.

#### **Belfast Hills**

Surrounding the Belfast area, the hills provide a unique

backdrop to the city. A walking trail around Cave Hill or Black Mountain is a great way to get some fresh air and enjoy the wildlife, upland heath, wildflowers and fantastic panoramic views across the city and beyond.

#### HILLSBOROUGH FOREST

Set in the picturesque
Georgian village of Royal
Hillsborough, Hillsborough
Forest is a popular choice

photographers, nature lovers
and bird watchers. The forest

sculptures each with a specific
theme reflecting the rich
history, heritage and culture
of Royal Hillsborough. Tire out

## THE WALLACE WALKING TRAIL

Wallace Park provides a green oasis in an urban landscape enjoyed by visiting dog walkers, families, cyclists and local workers on a lunchtime stroll. A monument to Sir Richard Wallace, who gifted the land for the park, was erected in 1892 by the people of Lisburn in 'grateful recognition of his generous interest in the prosperity of the town'. It stands in Castle Gardens, the most historically significant open space in Lisburn, opposite Castle House which was built by Wallace in 1880.

The Wallace Walking Trail leaflet is available from the Irish Linen Centre and Lisburn Museum or Lisburn Visitor Information Centre, and will take you around the different locations in Lisburn City Centre where Sir Richard left his mark.

#### **MOIRA DEMESNE**

Moira Demesne is located in the picturesque village of Moira, providing a quiet retreat from the bustling village. Comprised of over 40 acres of parkland, it offers areas of amenity grassland which incorporates beautiful walkways and picnic sites for everyone to enjoy. Numerous events take place in the Demesne during the summer months, including the popular Moira Speciality Food Fair.

#### **LAGAN TOWPATH**

The Lagan Towpath takes you along the river and canal system through a variety of wetland, riverside meadows and mixed woodland from Lisburn to Belfast. Home to a variety of wildlife, the canal system dates back to the late 18th century and many features still give an insight into the majestic era of the 'Lighter' – the horse-drawn boats that originally travelled on the Lagan Canal.
